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Rationale; Welsh Government Primary Care funding agreed for 2 years for Cardiff & Vale of Glamorgan with an aim to strengthen the preventative agenda by:- Improving the links between GPs and the community to deliver public health priorities and enhance a social model of care

Project Details; Wellbeing 4U is a community wellbeing service provided by the Thrive team of United Welsh Housing and Community Action Group on behalf of Cardiff and Vale University Health Board. A team of Wellbeing Coordinators and Wellbeing Assistants are available to help people to achieve their health goals through a flexible service that is tailor-made for them. People can be referred to use the service through their GP or other primary health care workers.

Team of 7, working across Cardiff and Vale UHB

- Senior Wellbeing coordinator, responsible for:
 - leading team
 - quality of service delivery
 - performance and data
 - partnership working



- Three teams of 2, a Wellbeing Coordinator and Wellbeing Assistant in:
 - Cardiff North, West and South West
 - Cardiff South, East and City
 - Vale of Glamorgan

Intended Outcomes;

- Mapping of community activities and services
- Improving immunisation and screening uptake
- Connect Notice

 Five ways to wellbeing
- Understanding areas of harmful behaviour; e.g. alcohol misuse, smoking to encourage a healthier lifestyle
- Increasing uptake of exercise
- Helping people to re-connect with their communities to reduce loneliness and isolation,
