Short project description	The Pre-Diabetes Early Intervention Programme follows the modelling of the All Wales Pre-Diabetic Prevention Programme piloted by Afan Valley and North Ceredigion Clusters, the project aims to improve the prevalence of type 2 diabetes in the South Powys population by supporting the introduction of a robust prevention and intervention pathway for patients who are or at risk of developing diabetes.		
Key objectives of this project	More than 7% of the adult population in Wales lives with diabetes. Managing diabetes and its complications in Wales accounts for 10% of the annual NHS Wales budget and costs approximately £500m per annum. Approximately 90% of people with diabetes have Type 2 Diabetes, much of which is entirely preventable and the biggest modifiable risk factor to developing Type 2 Diabetes is being overweight or obese.
